## **Elected Officials See First Hand the Daily Operation of a Day Support Center**

*Springfield, VA*— Central Fairfax Services, Inc. (CFS) recently hosted State Delegate Kaye Kory as part of their legislative outreach program. Leadership from CFS and the ServiceSource Network has been meeting with elected officials to share information on the affiliation between CFS and ServiceSource in order to give the officials an opportunity to tour both facilities to see how the programs benefit adults with intellectual disabilities in Northern Virginia.

“Everyone at CFS was delighted to have Delegate Kory spend the morning with us. She was very warm to our program participants and very aware of how the actions of the General Assembly can impact the quality of life for people with disabilities in our community,” explained Paul Wexler, executive director. “We regard Delegate Kory as a friend of our most vulnerable fellow citizens.”

Delegate Kory visited both CFS and ServiceSource on Wednesday, October 13. She met with Janet Samuelson, President and CEO of the ServiceSource Network and Paul Wexler, who is the Executive Director of CFS. Delegate Kory was able to meet with many of the participants who are part of the two organization’s programs. The affiliation of ServiceSource and CFS makes the combined agencies the largest provider of services to individuals with disabilities in Northern Virginia.

I met the dedicated professionals who deliver these key services and was impressed by their compassion and drive for excellence,” explained Kaye Kory, state delegate. “CFS and ServiceSource are valuable contributors to our commonwealth’s business-friendly reputation.”

Central Fairfax Services, Inc. (CFS) is a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) organization that provides day habilitation and vocational services to adults with disabilities in Northern Virginia. Since its incorporation in 1972, CFS has successfully provided services to more than 500 individuals with intellectual, developmental and physical disabilities. CFS currently serves more than 200 individuals on a daily basis. Incorporated in 1971, ServiceSource provides employment and rehabilitation services to people with disabilities and serves nearly 1,800 individuals. As part of the ServiceSource Network and with operations in nine states and the District of Columbia, the collective Network serves more than 11,000 people with disabilities nationwide of whom nearly 1,600 are directly employed.
